A 74-Year Tradition of Airmen Helping Airmen!

Emergency Assistance = \$8.1M

- ◆ \$6.4M interest-free loans
- ◆ \$1.7M grants
- ◆ 15,000 assists

Vehicle Expenses = \$2.1M
Emergency Travel = \$2.1M
Basic Living = \$2.9M
Funeral Expenses = \$328K
Medical/Dental = \$153K
Child Care/Respite = \$93K
Moving Expenses = \$165K



- ◆ 63 Wounded Warriors received nearly \$108K in direct assistance — 89% grants

Education Programs = \$6.3M

- ◆ Gen H.H. Arnold Education Grants = \$6M
2,632 grants of \$2,250 each for children and spouses
- ◆ Merit Scholarships = \$95K
19 dependent children earned \$5,000 scholarships
- ◆ Supplemental Education Loans = \$102K
82 families for 104 students received no-interest loans to help pay for incidental college expenses
- ◆ Youth Employment Skills = \$79K
82 high school students claimed a total of \$38K for post-secondary education expenses and 46 bases received \$41K to enhance their teen/youth program offerings
